

Explore hidden details throughout this handcrafted landmark with architectural historian **Cynthia Thompson** – time capsules, lima bean gates, bronze doors, carillon, monk faces, glass domes, marble halls and mahogany chambers – as she recreates opening day (July 5, 1913) of the Ventura County Courthouse.
