



FIRE LANE PARKING ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM

SCOPE

The property owner will furnish the Fire Chief with a letter dedicating to public use the property designated as a fire lane. Detailed plans of the proposed installation may be required.

Review of fire lane designation will be made by the Inspection Services Division (20 feet minimum unobstructed width of roadways to within 150 feet of all buildings). Sec. 902.2 California Fire Code.

Fire lane designated on private property shall be signed as follows:

- a. All entry roads shall be posted with an enforcement warning sign.
- b. "No Parking—Fire Lane" signs shall be posted at 50 foot intervals adjacent to the curb on all fire lanes, or as determined by the Inspection Services Division.
- c. All curbs adjacent to designated fire lanes shall be painted red.

ENFORCEMENT POLICY

- a. Fire lane warning cards shall be issued to all vehicles illegally parked for a period of 30-60 days after sign posting is completed. These warning cards can be issued by the Property Management or Fire Department personnel at the Fire Chief's discretion.
- b. Every effort shall be made to notify property users of impending enforcement (bulletins, newsletters, etc.)
- c. Enforcement (ticket issuing) by Department personnel will be performed to the degree determined necessary by the Fire Chief.

This will generally consist of an initial concentrated enforcement effort to establish credibility.

Continuing enforcement is dependent on personnel availability and the severity of the access problem as determined by the Fire Chief.

- d. Response to complaints of violations will be limited to the availability of personnel. Response will be at the discretion of the Fire Chief.
