–Drug – 1,056 (16%)


–Property Crimes/Robbery - 714 (11%)

Total Calls For Service (CFS) 2013:	82,582
Officer initiated traffic/subject stops	13,978 (16.9%)
Disturbances	5,350 (6.4%)
Suspicious circumstances	4,880 (5.9%)
Domestic violence	2,459 (2.9%)

Goal is to be on scene of an in-progress emergency call within 5 minutes 90% of the time.

Accountability

Complaints & Use of Force (UOF)

Number of Citizen Generated Complaints 2011 – 2013: 175

Primary complaint types: Discourtesy and Improper tactics

Total # of Arrests 2013: 4,426

Total # of Use of Forces in 2013: 99 (2.2% of all arrests)

Top Use of Force Incidents 2013:

- Take down: 70
- Twist lock: 29



Team Development

Reduce non-service related attrition by 10% when compared to prior 5 years average:

- 2009 - 2013: 4.7% (29)

Total Attrition:

- 2009 – 2013: 52 (23 retirements)

Hiring:

- 2012 - 37 backgrounds - 17 hired - 12 completed training
- 2013 - 32 backgrounds - 15 hired - 11 completed training
- 2014 - 50 backgrounds - 35 hired – 3-5 entering Academy, April 2015
